The Gospel of Mark 6.30-34, 53-end.

The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things. When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret and moored the boat. When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him, and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was. And wherever he went, into villages or cities or farms, they laid the sick in the market-places, and begged him that they might touch even the fringe of his cloak; and all who touched it were healed. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection on the Gospel

Jesus saw a great crowd and had compassion on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd. Shepherds of Jesus' time lived with their flocks. They protected them, cared for them if they fell sick, found them when they were lost and guided them in the right way. The shepherd had only one concern, the welfare of their flock. They led the flock, and the flock followed the shepherd. I'm sure you are familiar with the lines of the 23rd Psalm, "Your rod and your staff, they comfort me". These were the tools of the shepherd's trade. The Rod was a short club used as a weapon to defend the shepherd and his flock against attack. The staff was more like the modern-day shepherd's crook, used to guide and control the sheep. Now as we know, things will be changing over the next weeks as restrictions are relaxed. We all want to get back to normal as quickly as possible, but we know COVID is still around, with infections currently doubling every week, so to use a non-shepherding analogy: If you have successfully protected your house from floods with sandbags but the floodwater has not all gone, when it starts raining again is not the time to throw the sandbags away! Since the start of the pandemic the church leaders here have done what we consider necessary to keep all of the congregation safe. Jesus had compassion on the crowd because they were like sheep without a shepherd, but it was up to the crowd to decide whether they wanted to be his sheep. We will continue to exercise our responsibility to keep you as safe as possible, some restrictions will be relaxed but some will remain for a while longer. It will be your choice to follow them, and I urge you to act out of **personal responsibility, not personal choice; there is a difference**. Personal choice is choosing what the selfish me wants to do and personal responsibility is about doing what is right for everyone. Please accept the guidance of the shepherd's for just a while longer, and hopefully, the journey to the green pastures on the other side of our dark valley will be quicker and easier. Amen
